Tree Giveaway

The Lake District has again purchased trees to give away to landowners within the Lake District. The trees will be distributed Saturday, May 8th, beginning at 9:00 a.m., and going until the trees run out, or 11:00 a.m., whichever comes first. Four year old bare root trees, 25 each of White Pine, Red Maple, Norway Spruce, Service Berry, White Spruce, and Burr Oak were purchased. If you can use some trees, stop down and pick them up. Like last year, we expect the trees will go quickly.

CBCW

The Upper Turtle Lake District will be sponsoring a Clean Boats, Clean Waters (CBCW) project again this year at the public boat landing on Upper Turtle Lake. As a review, CBCW includes teams of volunteers, as well as paid staff, who perform boat and trailer checks, disseminate informational brochures and educate boaters on the prevention steps to stop the spread of Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS). These steps include:

Inspect your boat, trailer and equipment

Remove all attached plants or animals

Drain all water from boats, motors, live wells and other equipment

Never move live fish away from a waterbody

Dispose unwanted bait in the trash

Buy minnows from a Wisconsin bait dealer and use leftover minnows only if used on the same body of water or if no lake water or other fish were added to the container.

Following these steps also helps boaters comply with Wisconsin state law which prohibits the transport of aquatic invasive species.


2021 Notice of Aquatic Plant Management on Upper Turtle Lake

Based upon the pre and post-treatment surveys, the Lake District and its Lake Consultants have developed a proposed 2021 CLP treatment plan. The map on the next page indicates where treatment is anticipated to take place. Please note that the treatment areas may differ slightly based upon the upcoming pre-treatment survey. This serves as notice, as specified per Chapter NR 107, WI Administrative Code; that it intends to treat approximately 57.1 acres in Upper Turtle Lake with aquatic pesticides to control nuisance exotic aquatic vegetation curly leaf pondweed (CLP). The aquatic pesticide to be used is Aquathol K with the active ingredient endothall. Northern Aquatic Services out of Dresser, WI will complete the proposed treatment during the spring of 2021, sometime between ice out and late May, depending on weather conditions.

Additional information including maps and a copy of the permit application can be found at the lake district's website https://www.upperturtlelake.com/ Lake Education and Planning Services, the consultant working with the lake district will conduct a public informational meeting on the proposed treatment if five or more individuals, organizations, special units of government, or local units of government request one. Any request for a public meeting on this treatment must be made within five days after this notice is published. The request must specify the topics to be discussed at the

meeting, including problems and alternatives, and must be sent to: Lake Education and Planning Services, PO Box 26, Cameron, WI 54822 **and** to the WDNR at 810 W. Maple Street, Spooner WI 54801.

Secchi Disk Readings

A chart of the annual secchi disk readings has been posted on the Upper Turtle Lake District, located at www.upperturtlelake.com. Please take a look at the site! Secchi disks are the universal tool used to measure water clarity. Readings measure the depth at which the secchi disk ceases to be visible from the surface. The higher the number, the greater the water clarity.
