#### **Greetings UTLD Residents!**

Spring 2022 is approaching. I hope this newsletter finds you and your family healthy and well. Everyone will soon be enjoying the lake.... here are a few lakeshore best practices to improve our lake clarity:

- -Grass clippings and leaves create phosphorus, the nutrient that feeds algae, and turns lakes green. Please refrain from allowing these to enter the lake.
- -Check your septic tanks to ensure proper operating condition.
- -Rake your shoreline, and remove raked plants from the water.
- --Buffer strips grow native plants (i.e black eyed Susans, big bluestem, and snowberry) along shoreline to prevent runoff.
- -There is Grant money (to be applied for) that can cover expenses of rain gardens and buffer strips. More information can be found at Healthy Lakes and Rivers.
  -UTLD will be once again asking for volunteers to work the boat landing inspecting boats. This helps mitigate additional invasive species coming to our lake. We have a paid worker that will cover 100 hours, and need 100

### 2022 Aquatic Plant Management Plan Activities

Most of us wait patiently through the cold winter months for the arrival of spring and lake activities. As Lake District Commissioners, we have heard quite a few questions on why the lake isn't being treated for the invasive species Curly Leaf Pondweed (CLP) this year. We wanted to take this time to explain and briefly revisit the overall plan.

With the alarming infestation of CLP in 2017, an Aquatic Plant Management (APM) Plan was developed to address the situation. This plan was a five-year plan that spelled out the mitigation activities through 2022, and the plan was approved by the Wisconsin DNR. Included in this plan was a three-year treatment cycle followed by an evaluation year to determine if the CLP and CLP Turion (seed) levels would return to a healthy acceptable level. Additionally, the APM Plan also included an objective to restore and maintain native aquatic plant species to healthy diverse levels.

The Lake District is now in the evaluation stage of the current plan. This year will be used to evaluate the success of activities relative to invasive CLP as well as progress on the return of important native species to the lake's ecosystem. In addition, this year's evaluation will also lay the groundwork for the next five-year APM Plan by providing a new baseline of Upper Turtle Lake's ecosystem. The Lake District Commissioners are working on the next phase of the APM plan, if you have any input, please contact any of the Commissioners.

## **Barron County Groundwater Study**

As you may have heard, Barron County is working with the Groundwater Center of UW Stevens Point on a study of groundwater in the county. Letters were be sent to prospective well owners across the county. The list was derived using a database of wells constructed after 1990 as they have information on the depth, casing and geologic formation of the well. The goal is to test 400 wells this year.

It is the coverage of the county that will allow us to determine overall safety of well water quality and provides a baseline for future tracking of changes in groundwater quality over time. If you get one of these letters, you are encouraged to participate in this project.

After this year's round of testing, we will be looking at the data, and using it to guide the selection of another 400 wells in 2023. If you aren't selected this year, you may be in 2023.

#### Remember when?

A question about the origin of the Upper Turtle Lake boat parade was put out, and here's a response that was received from Peg Wohlers: "My dad (Chuck Nelsen) and neighbor (Curt Kalmes) were always up to something, and wanted to put on a bicentennial show for the lake. 1976 was the first "Big Pull". It took half the day just to get set up and gather 10 pairs of skis and all the ropes and life jackets. It was quite a production! We set up in Kruger's yard, and once all 10 were in place we would slowly walk into the water and put on our skis. Dad's boat had a 70 HP Evinrude, but he would tie the neighbor's boat (60 HP) to his boat to get us all up and out of the water. Once all 10 of us were up, they untied the 2<sup>nd</sup> boat. We'd go around the lake waving and laughing. This tradition went on for easily 4-5 years and then turned into the annual 4<sup>th</sup> of July parade. There was a potluck picnic hosted by my parents in our yard."
